

## 5 year Bible reading plan – week 77

### **Week 77 - 29/04/18**

**Monday: Mark 5:21-43.** In both these cases, Jesus showed that he desired a relationship with those he helped rather than being an impersonal power source. In what area of your life do you need a fresh touch from Jesus?

**Tuesday: Exodus 18:1-27.** Jethro, Moses' father-in-law picked up on the fact that Moses was doing everything himself. What are the dangers of this and how good are you at delegating responsibility out to others?

**Wednesday: 1 Samuel 24:1-22.** A king's robe was a symbol of his office and so David cutting off a piece of Saul's robe caused Saul to reflect upon what he had done. What can we learn from the way David handled himself when it comes to treating those in authority?

**Friday: Jeremiah 8:1-22.** Even though the people have done wrong and deserve all that seems to be coming their way, how does Jeremiah react and respond to this? What would have been your heart attitude?

**Weekend: 2 Corinthians 6:11-18.** The idea of the double yoke has Old Testament roots (Deuteronomy 22:10) where it was forbidden to put an ox and a donkey together because they were incompatible and it would make it impossible to plow in a straight line. What pitfalls are there in being unequally yoked in relationships and the business arena?
