

Monday: Psalm 11:1-7. Key verses 2 & 3: Remember that when it seems as if the things you have built your life upon are shaken, that God is still in control. Focus on His faithfulness to you in worship today.

Tuesday: Psalm 14:1-7. Consider: When you remove God and His standards from your thinking you have no real basis left for moral decisions of "right or wrong". History shows that v 1 (atheism) ultimately leads to v 3 (corruption). Pray for friends and family who have nothing to really celebrate this Christmas.

Wednesday: Psalm 16:1–11. Praise: verse 10 is quoted in Acts 2:31,32 as a "Messianic Psalm". As we celebrate the birth of the baby, remember also His death and resurrection. Born uncorrupted, He avoided the corruption and decay of the grave, and now is in heaven as our Priest and our King.

Thursday: Psalm 19:1-14. Worship: Before the birth of Jesus, the best way to understand God's character was through creation (v1) and the Law (v7). Since the first Christmas, the best way to know God is to get to know Jesus, God's last word and ultimate revelation of Himself. Read Hebrews 1:1-3 and worship Jesus today!

Friday: Psalm 23:1-6. Reflect: Whatever you need today, the answer is found in Jesus Christ, the great shepherd of our soul. Which verse speaks into your greatest need today? Turn it into a confession of weakness, and a prayer for Christ's all - sufficient grace.

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
