

## **Week 188 w/c 14/6/20**

**Monday: John 9:1-23.** Verse 4 reminds us that just as Jesus had work to do on behalf of his father, so we have to do the same. What do you have to do for God today? What aspects of God's works have you neglected? What do you think Jesus meant when he spoke of the "night coming, when no-one can work"?

**Tuesday: Deuteronomy 5:1-33.** It is important to remember that each generation must face up to God's commandments and principles, and so Moses reminds them that this Covenant was being made with them and not just their ancestors (v3). Have you rejected principles that previous generations held on to which you should re-examine?

**Wednesday: 1 Chronicles 28:1-21.** How did David react when God said "no" to his prayers and heart's desire to build the temple? What can you learn from his example? Are you as willing to not be used to fulfil God's purposes, if that is his plan? What are you doing to prepare the way for the next generation to fulfil God's purposes?

**Thursday: Psalm 119:153-160.** Turn each of the eight verses into a prayer or an expression of praise and speak them out to the Lord today.

**Friday: Daniel 6:1-28.** Daniel did what he had always done despite the King's new decree (see v10). When is it right to disobey the law of the land, as Daniel did, and trust God as you face the consequences? If he had not survived the Lion's den would you still think this was an act of faith and bravery, or would you regard it as foolish and unwise?

**Weekend: Hebrews 9:1-10.** Do you agree or disagree with the following statements? "Why is all the ritual and emphasis on following the plans exactly, included in the Old Testament? Because, context and environment are important when we come to worship, symbolism helps us remember when we approach God, ceremony and ritual bring truth and security in praise and surrender, precision and beauty focus the mind and heart."
