

Bible Readings Book by Book week 61 – w/c 1/1/23

Week 61

Monday: Romans 10:14-21. Verse 14 is a great challenge. Some are lost because nobody has shared the good news with them. What are you doing to ensure everyone has an opportunity to receive Christ?

Tuesday: Romans 11:1-24. Paul makes it clear that Israel has not been totally or finally rejected. He was living proof that the Jews could still be saved by faith, and he longs for others of his own race to come to saving faith in Christ. Do you have the same passion for the salvation of your nation?

Wednesday: Romans 11:25-36. The word doxology comes from the Greek doxa (glory, splendor) and logos (word or speaking). Just as Paul did, why not speak out praise to God for all his blessings and declare who he is to you.

Thursday: Romans 12:1-8. Pride refuses to accept God's gifts or views itself too highly; humility is accepting our gifts and using them to serve God. Don't deny, belittle, or ignore your gifts but view yourself in a balanced way through the eyes of faith! (v3)

Friday: Romans 12:9-21. Verse 18 is a great principle to live by! Do all you can to live at peace with others, but when it doesn't depend on you (but them), don't beat yourself up about it!

Weekend: Romans 13:1-7. Paul very firmly states that we must submit ourselves to governing authorities. Why does he say this? Why not pray for someone who is in authority in your home, school, church or city?
